

Eminent Emmanuel S Wettee

My National Award Is Dedicated To All Liberians



minent Emmanuel S Wettee, originally from the Republic of Liberia, came to Columbus, Ohio, on Tuesday, December 31, 1991. He worked for the State of Ohio for 30 years and retired officially on December 31, 2022. Eminent Wettee currently teaches Computer-related classes at the Columbus State Community College, having been teaching since 1997. From his early years, Wettee's leadership was evident, consistently elected to student council roles. Forced to relocate to the United States in 1991 due to Liberia's civil crisis, he continued his advocacy and community service, leading Liberian organizations in Ohio,

mentoring students as an Adjunct Faculty at Columbus State Community College, and championing immigration protections for Liberians under TPS and DED during his tenure as the 23rd President of ULAA.

His most notable achievement came as Chairman of the All-Liberian Conference on Dual Citizenship (ALCOD), where his tireless lobbying under the theme "Once a Liberian Always a Liberian" culminated in the passage of Liberia's dual citizenship law in 2022. For his steadfast advocacy, he has been honored with multiple leadership awards and, in 2025, was admitted into the Humane Order of African Redemption as Knight Commander by President Joseph Nyuma Boakai. Eminent Emmanuel S Wettee spoke with the Deba Uwadiae, publisher, New Americans magazine on the path to the Humane Order of African Redemption as Knight Commander.

National Honor

When the Republic of Liberia is celebrating Independence Day, they always honor Liberians or people who have made a difference in the country. This year, on July 24th, I was one of those they honored. I was honored with the Humane Order of African Redemption, with the rank of Knight Commander, by President Joseph Nyuma Boakai. That is the highest Honor that the Republic of Liberia can give to anyone. This is for the work that my team and I have done.

Advocacy

We advocated for Liberians in the United States for the extension of the Temporary Protected Status, TPS in 2007, and with the direction that Deferred Enforced Departure (DED) be provided to every Liberian on TPS whose status was due to expire, to be given work authorization and traveling documents. Years later, those advocacies paid off again when Liberians were qualified. We also advocated for dual citizenship in Liberia, and we were granted. Based on all those things that we have achieved, we were honored by the President and people of Liberia on July 24th, 2025.

Dual Citizenship

Since 1973/1974, a law has been in place that says if you are born outside Liberia or naturalized in another country that you are not a citizen of Liberia. In 2012, Liberians from around the globe, Europe, Australia, Africa, America and Canada, met in Washington DC, where we developed a comprehensive plan on how to address the issue of dual citizenship in Liberia. On July 22, 2021, that demand was granted and signed into law by the President.

Before the law was passed, it was only the men in Liberia who can pass on citizenship to their children. If a Liberian woman gave birth to a child by a different nationality, that child cannot be a Liberian. Another interesting part of the constitution was that only a Liberian can own a parcel of land in the country. So, if you come from this side, whether America, Australia, if you are naturalized, you are no longer a Liberian, and so you can no longer own a parcel of land. Most people go through a third party

to own a parcel of land. If you have issues with the third party, it can be friends or family, they will tell you, according to our law, you are not a Liberian, and you have no right to the property.

Diasporan

At that time, every time we go home, we're not welcome. We decided it was about time that we all pulled forces and our resources together and advocated that this law be changed. We in the diaspora are the ones that are helping and supporting our people, and no one is more Liberian than we are, and we too are not more Liberian than those at home. We are all Liberians. If we do not change the law we cannot own a land. our children born in America. Europe, Australia and Canada are not Liberians. If they intend to go to the land of their fathers, they are not Liberians. All these things factored in, we decided to change the law. Since 2012, we have been advocating for the change of the law, and now we have it. We now have dual citizenship. Any child that is born by a Liberian, in respective of the pigmentation, can now be a Liberian, including a child born by a Liberian woman. Also, when it comes to voting, we can vote, but you'll have to travel to Liberia to vote.

Visas

Before now, you'll apply for visas to travel to Liberia. But now you have many options if you want to travel to Liberia. You can choose to travel with a Liberian passport, or you can have visas on arrival. It is good to have a Liberian passport. It allows you to visit some other African countries.

Passport

The process is to go to the website

or any Liberian Embassy or consulate in any part of the world to apply for your passport. One of the key requirements is your birthday certificate to show that you were born in Liberia or that your parents or grandparents are from Liberia. There are other provisions as well. The good thing is that once you are a Liberian, you are always a Liberian.

News

I got a telephone call from the Deputy Foreign Affairs Minister, Consul Gregory: she called me and told me that "you have been nominated and expected to receive a national honor." Just the fact that the President and the people of Liberia recognized the work we did in the diaspora, for me, this award is for everybody. It demonstrates the efforts and what we are doing for our people. Liberians in diaspora are very happy. They are all excited about what we have achieved. If we continue to work together, we can accomplish more.

The Liberians In Columbus Inc., LICI is making a great impact in Columbus. We are a shining star in the community. To every diasporan, this is home to us. We should respect the law, work hard, live honestly and move on. From my own experience, if you work hard, you will be rewarded. Columbus is a very good place. It is our home. I appreciate the people of the state of Ohio for giving me the opportunity to work in the government and retire honorably. I want to thank all the people of Liberia in America for their support.



Ohio First Lady Fran DeWine Hopes to Make Dolly Parton's Imagination Library Sustainable

hio First Lady Fran DeWine drives
Dolly Parton's Imagination Library of
Ohio which mails children one free
book each month until his or her fifth
birthday. Any child between birth
to age five in Ohio can sign up for
this free book gifting program. The
Imagination Library's high-quality, age-appropriate
books help children develop critical early literacy skills
before starting kindergarten. First Lady Fran DeWine
recently gave an update on Dolly Parton's Imagination
Library of Ohio in an interaction with journalists.

Imagination Library Update

The story about the imagination library started years before Mike ran for Governor. My grandkids got books in the mail, and I found how excited they were getting the books from the mail. The two grandkids were ripping it over and saying to me, "Read to me, grandma!" They were so excited. I thought this was cool. I found out that it was through the county library. As soon as Mike became Governor, I thought "this is what I want to do". I wanted to make books available, not just where I was in Ohio, but I wanted to make books available to every single child in Ohio. That was fun for me. I started going to each county, picking a partner in each county. The partners raised the money. Every week, we meet a couple of legislators, and I will tell my story and help us make this happen.

Partners

The way it works now, we work with our partners in every county. They sign the kids up for books. They

paid half of it and the state legislature matches the other half.

Kids

At this point, we have 412,000 kids. This is a high. We keep growing up. We give up to 412,000 kids free books every single month until they turn five years old. That is 62 % of the kids in Ohio who are under five, but really, it's 70% of households because some people choose not to get two or three books if they have two or three kids. We encourage them to sign up for all the kids. Research shows that a child's brain is 80% developed before turning three.

Efforts

We know we have neighborhoods where kids are not being signed up. For the whole state, we try to do birth certificates' signing up. When a woman has a baby in the hospital and they try to fill up the birth certificate and paperwork, on the next page, they check one box and their kids are signed up. Our numbers are going up from that, and we are excited about that. Our numbers are going up in the cities, and we are excited about that too.

Number 1

We are number one in the country as far as our program. My challenge now is to make this sustainable. I am working every day to make sure that each partner raises the money. The Rotary Club is doing a lot. There are a lot of ways they are doing it.



American Profanity

Why America Has Better Than Donald Trump to Offer

merica's story is one woven from the threads of diverse origins, a tapestry that defies the simplistic narratives often peddled in heated political rhetoric. From the earliest days, the nation's foundations were laid by waves of immigrants, refugees

fleeing persecution, colonial soldiers hailing from distant lands like England, France, and Germany, and enslaved Africans forcibly brought to these shores against their will. Many of those enslaved people came from West Africa, where Islam had a presence, though the majority practiced indigenous religions or were later converted to Christianity under duress.

Figures like Frederick Douglass, an escaped slave turned abolitionist, or Harriet Tubman, who led countless to freedom, embody this complex heritage. Even icons such as Thomas Jefferson, a descendant of Welsh immigrants, or Alexander Hamilton, born in the Caribbean, underscore how America's greatness stems from its mosaic of backgrounds. This history isn't just a footnote—it's the essence of what has made the United States a beacon of opportunity, innovation, and resilience.

Yet, in recent years, former and current President Donald Trump has repeatedly targeted segments of American society he perceives as vulnerable, using inflammatory language to insult, discriminate, and stoke enmity against them. This tactic often appears designed to distract from substantive policy discussions and unfulfilled campaign promises, such as comprehensive infrastructure reform or balanced trade deals that truly benefit working-class Americans.

Instead of focusing on deliverables for the Oval Office, Trump has singled out specific communities to appeal to a base he believes responds to divisive rhetoric. A prime example is his recent tirade against Somali immigrants in Minnesota, where he labeled them "garbage" and declared he doesn't "want them in our country." This echoes his past attacks on other groups: calling Mexican immigrants "rapists" and criminals during his 2015 campaign launch, proposing a "total and complete shutdown" of

Muslims entering the U.S., spreading baseless claims about Haitian immigrants in Ohio eating pets, and deriding Central American caravans as "invasions."

Communities like the Somalis in Minnesota—majority of whom are U.S. citizens contributing as entrepreneurs, educators, and public servants—suddenly found themselves vilified by the very leader sworn to protect all Americans, whether at home or abroad. Such statements not only alienate these groups but also signal to U.S. allies and adversaries that America's commitment to its diverse citizenry is conditional.

The majority of Americans, polls and public discourse suggest, are repulsed by this vitriol emanating from the White House, save for a vocal minority influenced by echo-chamber media and amplified bigoted voices. This rhetoric isn't just distracting, it's destructive. Domestically, it frays the social fabric, fostering division in communities where unity is essential for progress. Internationally, it erodes America's moral authority, making it harder to champion human rights or lead coalitions against tyranny when our own leadership echoes exclusionary tropes. How can the U.S. credibly promote democracy abroad while its president undermines it at home through targeted harassment of citizens?

Importantly, America is not synonymous with Donald Trump. While he enjoys First Amendment protections to voice his opinions—no matter how distasteful—his power to act on threats against American citizens, whether in the U.S. or overseas, is constitutionally constrained. The executive branch cannot unilaterally deport citizens or strip rights without due process and checks like congressional oversight and judicial review stand as bulwarks.

Looking back, the best course of action for the U.S. Congress should have been swift bipartisan condemnation, perhaps through resolutions or investigations into whether such rhetoric incites violence or violates ethical standards for public officials. Censure or even impeachment proceedings could have been pursued if the comments crossed into impeachable territory, as seen in past administrations.

For the American media and civil society, the role must be proactive: not just reactive reporting or protests for affected groups like the Somalis, but vigilant fact-checking, amplifying diverse voices, and holding power accountable to safeguard everyone's freedoms—because unchecked authoritarianism threatens all skins, regardless of color or origin.

The judiciary, meanwhile, will need to reinforce constitutional guardrails, swiftly adjudicating cases of discrimination, executive overreach, or threats to civil liberties, ensuring that no one person can erode the rule of law.

In the end, to Somali-Americans and all communities feeling the sting of exclusion: America's promise of better days endures, rooted in a history of overcoming division through collective resolve. And to fellow Americans, now is the time to stand for what is right—not out of charity, but because our shared future demands it. Rejecting hate and embracing our pluralistic strength is the only way we can reaffirm that this nation offers far more than fleeting profanity; it offers enduring hope.



Life Insurance

Life insurance is a way to help protect your family if something happens to you. If a person with life insurance dies, the insurance company gives money to their family. This money can help replace the income or paycheck that the person used to bring home, so their loved ones can still pay for important things like food, a home, or school. For many families, life insurance is also a way to leave a financial gift, or inheritance, to help support children and future generations. It's like a promise to keep taking care of the people you love, even if you are not there. Many people are surprised to learn that life insurance is much more affordable than they think. In fact, according to the 2023 Insurance Barometer Study by LIMRA and Life Happens, most people overestimate the cost of life insurance by three times or more. For example, a healthy 30-year-old can often get \$250,000 of term life insurance for less than \$20 a month. (*Source: 2023 Insurance Barometer Study – LIMRA and Life Happens).

Age

You can get life insurance at almost any age. Some life insurance are for children, and some are for adults. Most people get life insurance when they are grown

up, but parents can buy it for their children too. It is very important to get life insurance when you are young. When you are younger, it is usually much cheaper and easier to get. If you wait until you are older or if you get sick, it can cost more or be harder to get life insurance. Getting it early helps make sure your family is always protected.

The price of life insurance depends on a few things:

- Your age
- Your height and weight
- If you are a smoker or non-smoker
- Your health when you apply

Types


There are two main types of life insurance:
Term life insurance: This lasts for a certain number of years, like 10, 20, or 30 years. If something happens during that time, your family gets money.
Whole life insurance: This lasts your whole life. As long as you pay for it, your family will get money when you pass away. Whole life insurance also has something called "cash value." This means that, over time, your policy can grow money that you can use while you are still alive.

Life insurance helps protect your family and gives them money to help with important things if you are not there.

Other Coverage

Most people have some life insurance through their job. Usually, this coverage is only one or two times their yearly salary. This amount is often not enough to pay for final expenses or to support a family if something happens and there is only one income left. Also, if you change jobs, you usually cannot take this life insurance with you. Sometimes, there can be a gap of up to 90 days before your new job's life insurance starts—if your new employer even offers it. That's why I strongly encourage everyone to get extra life insurance outside of what your job provides. This is especially important for people who are self-employed or part of the new American community. Taking this step helps make sure your family is protected, no matter what happens.

he saying "Life is 10% what happens to you and 90% how you react to it" reminds me that while we can't always control the events in our lives, we do have full control over our responses.

To me, it means

that attitude and perspective shape our experiences more than the events themselves.

For example, I grew up in Mazar. My father worked for the Americans in a government office before the Taliban came to Afghanistan. His job put him in danger, but he enjoyed his job. When the Taliban took over Mazar, my father received a warning call from a friend that his life was in danger and so he fled from the Taliban to the capital, Kabul.

A few days later, the rest of our family joined him in Kabul. However, the same day we arrived in Kabul, the Taliban took over this city, too. We were very afraid during this time, and my hope was that we would receive permission to emigrate to the United States.

We first received asylum status from the country of Germany and my family lived there without my father for two years. My father didn't want to put us in danger, so he hid in Afghanistan for two months until it was safer to travel and then he received asylum in Pakistan for two years. Eventually, in 2023, my family united in America. We lived in New Jersey for a year and now are settled in Columbus, Ohio.

During this time, I kept a positive attitude and did my best to keep up my mother's faith that things would be okay. In Germany, I helped my family by learning some German and going out to speak with people when we went

shopping. The German people were very friendly and helpful. I also told my mom that everything was going to work out okay, and one day we would join my dad in America. I gave her hope, and this helped her through this time.

Now, we have a very good life in America, and I am very happy and grateful to be here.

Another hardship that isn't spoken about very much is that under the Taliban in Afghanistan, girls have no rights, and they can neither go to school, work, nor out shopping. The only thing

they can do is to get married.

However, now that I am out of that place, I am grateful for the American education I am receiving. A single student, even one who has fled from oppression in her homeland, can make a big difference in creating a school environment that promotes positivity. I have done this by showing respect to teachers and classmates, participating actively in class and encouraging others.

When I think about the fact that girls in my country don't have rights, I want to do something for the other girls in my country. I know I will someday help these girls, and this gives me hope and a positive attitude.

And one more thing that I learned from my life is if I face a setback, I can choose to be discouraged, or I can see it as a learning opportunity. This mindset has taught me to focus on solutions rather than dwelling on problems.

I think this story should be told because a lot of people don't have a positive attitude. And I believe that this story shows them that when we have a positive attitude, we can accept the biggest problems and easily solve them.

It's an untold story about how maintaining a positive attitude can help us all in many ways. Having a positive attitude has helped me and my friends. For instance, during group projects, I try to stay optimistic even when things don't go

smoothly. My encouragement often helps the group stay motivated and focused. Friends and classmates have told me that my positive outlook helps ease their stress, making challenges feel more manageable.

I believe that how we react to challenges, how we support our learning environment, and how we maintain a positive attitude all contribute to our personal growth and the well-being of those around us. My experiences have shown me that one person really can make a meaningful difference.


In short, I believe staying positive and helping others creates a stronger, better community. And I'm so grateful for the chance to share my story with you.


